

Be Donation Savvy!

For the sanitation and safety of our shelter, we can not accept the following items at the shelter:

- Quilts
- Rugs
- Crocheted blankets
- Blankets or guilts with stuffing or padding
- Pillows
- Dog bed larger than 24" x 48"
- Dog beds without removable covers
- Leather or hard plastic leashes
- Choke chains
- Broken or modified crates and kennels
- Used or expired medications
- Food donations not in the original packaging

However, these items we totally appreciate and utilize all the time at the shelter:

- Used bath-sized towels
- Used blankets with no padding
- Used pet beds with removable, washable covers
- Training pads
- Dog and cat toys
- Grain-free dry dog food
- Open bags of dry dog and cat food
- Unopened cans of wet dog and cat food
- Dog and cat treats
- Scratching posts
- Unmixed kitten milk replacement




Local Pre-school Visits MVAS
